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### <u>Dounreay Competition - Socio-Economic Update</u>

Socio-economic matters remain a matter of fundamental interest in the competition. The NDA attaches great importance to these issues at Dounreay, and hence the treatment of socio-economic requirements continues to be a key feature of the NDA's thinking in its ongoing work developing the evaluation criteria and methodology.

The approach to the socio-economic criteria has been developed in three strands:

## 1. The definition of socio-economic requirements relative to both the SLC and the PBO:

- The NDA will incorporate socio-economic performance requirements in the competed SLC and PBO contracts.
- The NDA has consulted stakeholders in developing these socio-economic requirements, and all input suggestions are being incorporated in the draft statement of requirements. The NDA will share the final version.

#### 2. The treatment of socio-economics in the tender evaluation process:

- Socio-economic requirements are very important and will be treated accordingly in the evaluation model.
- The NDA is currently undertaking extensive work to develop the proposed evaluation methodology, and in doing so continues to take account of stakeholders' views.
- Development work on the evaluation model is scheduled to be completed in time for a governance approval submission in mid-October.
- Subject to the completion of development work and the outcome of the October governance review, the NDA is minded to promote the fulfilment of socio-economic requirements to one of very few 'threshold status' items in the evaluation model.
- Threshold status for socio-economics would result in:
  - The NDA rejecting any tender which failed to provide a robust and effective undertaking to meet the defined socio-economic requirements (referred to in paragraph 1 above), no matter how attractive **any** other features of the tender were.
  - Socio-economic requirements being much better underpinned than under a percentage weighting regime, since a weighted scoring process could result in a tender which scored poorly on socio-economics nevertheless winning if high scores were achieved in all other areas.
  - Socio-economics being afforded similar evaluation status to safety.
- In their final tenders, Bidders will be required to show how they will meet the NDA's stated socio-economic requirements.
- The NDA's socio-economic subject matter experts will evaluate these elements of the final tender responses to ensure that they provide full and effective responses to the agreed socio-economic requirements.

- 3. The means by which ongoing fulfilment of socio-economic requirements will be embedded in the awarded contracts.
  - The ongoing fulfilment of socio-economic requirements <u>will</u> be an enduring contractual obligation in the awarded Dounreay SLC and PBO contracts – note that this is a stronger position than that adopted in either the LLWR or Sellafield contracts

#### Bidder engagement with stakeholders

The NDA is encouraging Bidders to liaise with stakeholders on their thoughts, prior to submitting their final socio economic commitment - and understand that this is currently underway. The NDA will also facilitate a period of formal engagement in late 2010.
