It appears that this letter was sent on the same date that I responded to your letter of the 1st November. I attach a further copy of my letter of the 29th November which hopefully addresses your questions.

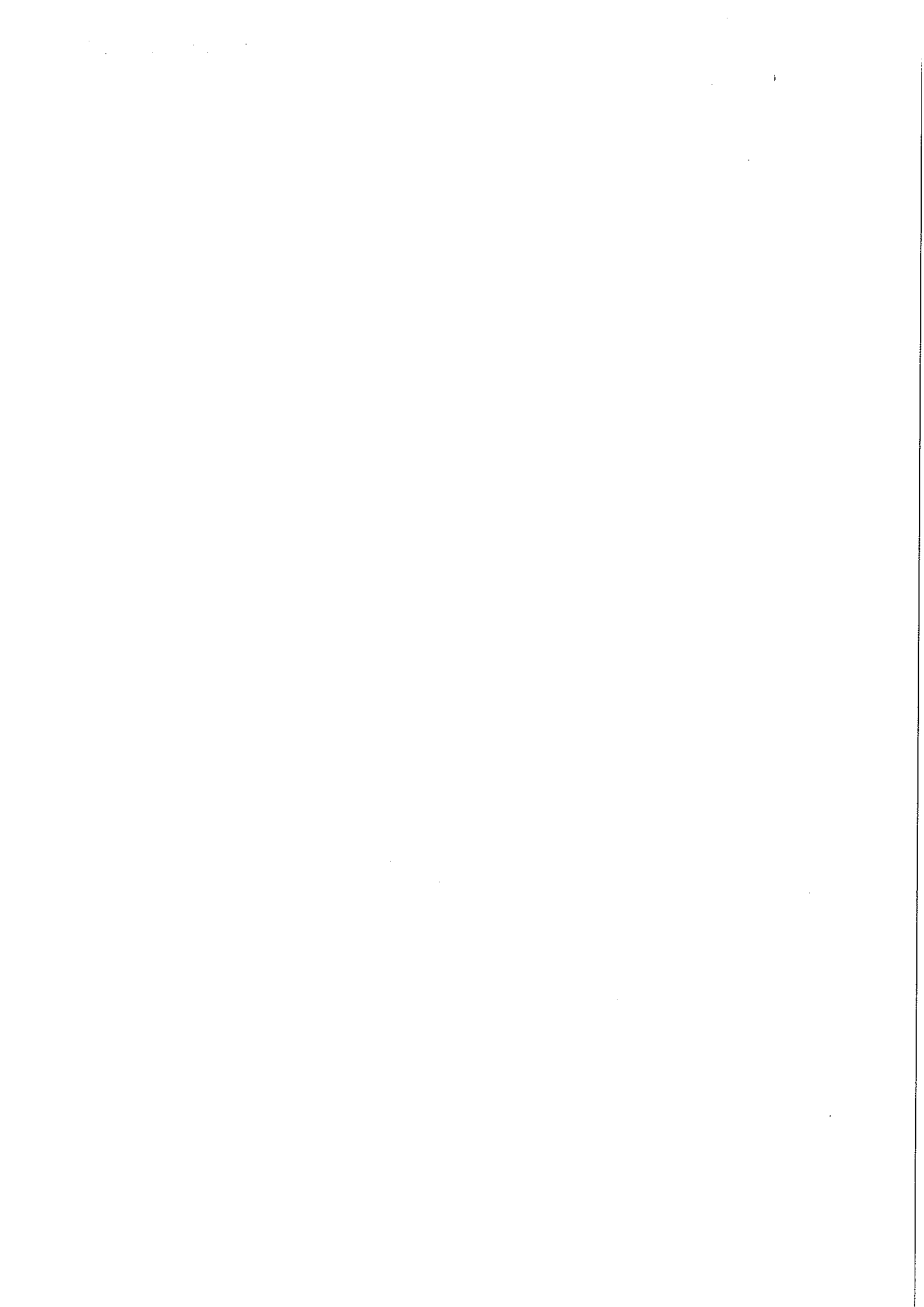

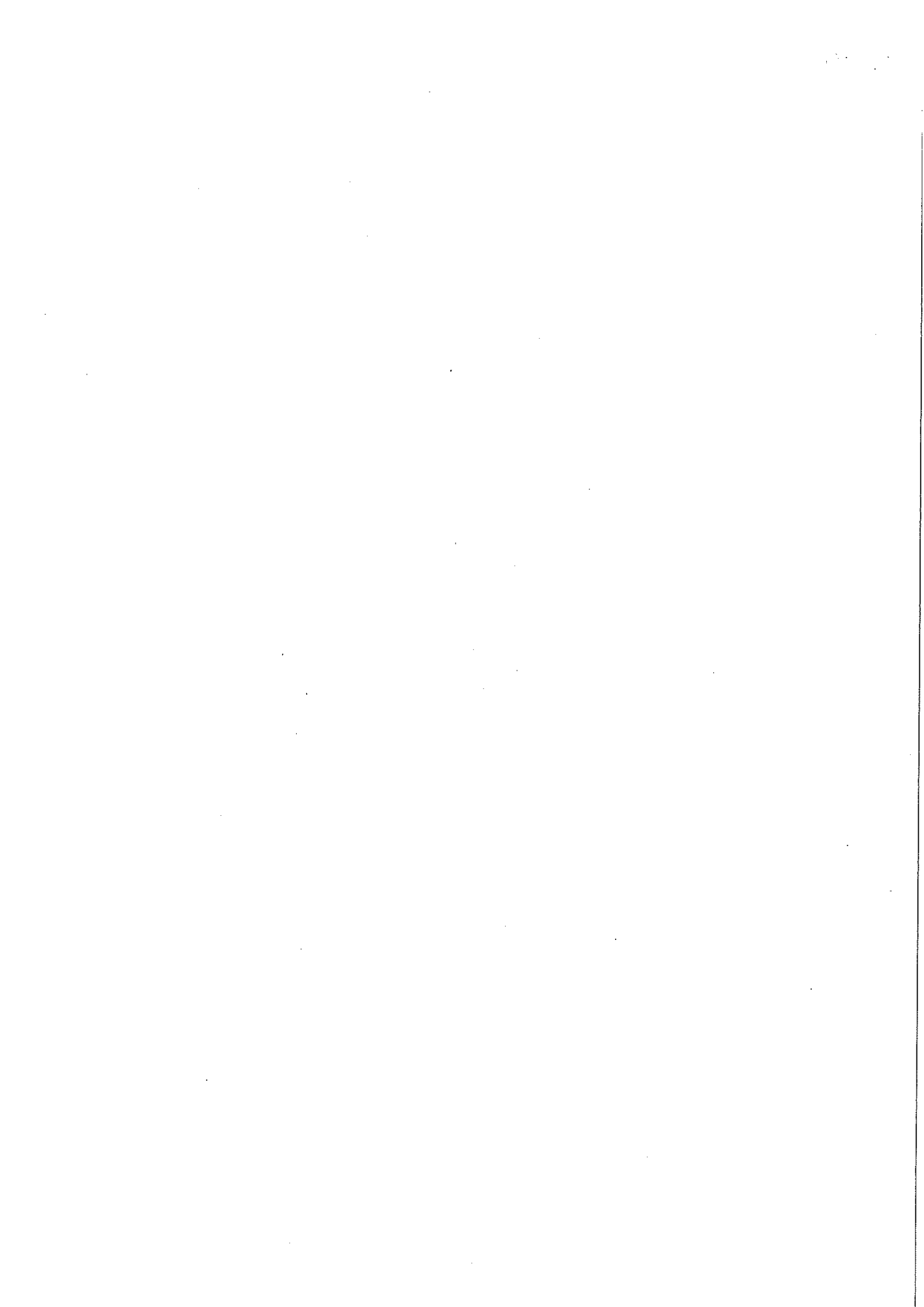
Dear Mr Milnes

Thank you for your letter of 1st November on the subject of local Crown Estate presence and local stakeholder engagement in Caithness.

Based on our experience with the offshore wind sector The Crown Estate has seen that the early build out of projects will be a significant factor in achieving early local employment benefits and to this end we are working with developers and stakeholders to coordinate and de-risk the delivery of the Pentland Firth & Orkney waters wave and tidal projects. To assist in this effort we have committed to an investment of over £5m in enabling projects in the Pentland Firth and Orkney waters over the next 4 years.

On a local level we continue to work in partnership with the Pentland Firth & Orkney waters co-ordination committee (PFOGCC) to determine how local stakeholder engagement is continually improved. This remains ongoing although there is general recognition in the PFOGCC that local stakeholder engagement is best undertaken by one or more of the partners depending upon the specific purpose of the engagement i.e. HIE on local supply chain investment opportunities, or project developers on project specific issues. The Crown Estate is continuing to undertake local stakeholder engagement and an example of this is in organising (in this case jointly with HIE) the public information days that will update progress of the wave & tidal developments. This event will be held in Caithness at the end of November as a repeat of the successful information days held in November 2010.
