

Safety and Security Responsibilities of the Transport of Radioactive Material (including nuclear material) in Great Britain.

The following is a short paper describing the regulations and regulatory function of the transport of radioactive material in Great Britain covering the four modes (road, rail air and sea)

All safety requirements for the transport of radioactive material are based on the International Atomic Energy Agency (United Nation Body)



Each of the modes is regulated within GB.

ONR's Transport programme is also responsible for the approval of certain types of packages used to carry radioactive material such as fissile material, type B packages on behalf of the UK government.

Security Responsibilities

Security responsibilities are split in to two areas:-.

Transport of Nuclear material.

ONR's Civil Nuclear Security programme regulates security at civil licensed nuclear sites, and all other locations where sensitive nuclear information is held; and the movement by road and rail within the UK, and globally within UK flagged vessels of nuclear and other radioactive material.

Transport of radioactive material.

Department for Transport (DfT) Maritime and Land Transport Security Division covers the policy for land and sea. DfT also enforces the compliance of Air and Maritime Transport. Office for Nuclear Regulation's Transport programme enforces the compliance for road and rail.
