Eann Sinclair reported that he had now received a final draft and expected this to be completed in time for the CNSRP Advisory Board. The study follows up from the one carried out in 2006 and attempts to measure what has changed in the interim in terms of demographics and the impact of Dounreay (on both DSRL and supply chain). The previous study estimated 15% of jobs were dependent on Dounreay while the updated report shows a figure around 10%. Calculations on self employed were down from 13% compared to 8% in 2006. This showed a broad indicator that the economy was changing and there was a marked increase of business start-ups.

The measure that CNSRP had set out was to increase the GDP of the area but it was now recognised that this may not be the best indicator for measuring success and it may well be that it should be measured on employment figures. This is one of the things that he would be taking to Executive Board on 26th April because while some of the statistics were encouraging a clear decision on how it is measured is required. It was agreed that members would benefit from information on the employment statistics. He also agreed to send the website link to the study when it was published.

Eann Sinclair was invited to provide a verbal update. Eann noted the following:

- CNSRP had facilitated a meeting between a number of local organisations and Scottish Power Renewables (SPR). Energy Hunt was now working with SPR who have indicated they intend to be in Caithness for the next 30 years. Those attending the meeting agreed that a quarterly meeting would be useful for the next 2 years and then it would be reviewed going forward.

Sandy Mackie, Scrabster Harbour Trust, said the EZ status would assume that the site was sufficiently developed for tenants to take advantage of. DSG members indicated a willingness to support Scrabster in moving this forward where appropriate.

Alan could see a missing generation factor whereby local people could be trained here and then would leave the county for higher paid work.

Alastair MacDonald (Dounreay) agreed and said that was why the emphasis was on creating jobs in the area. It may be that while people do leave the area they do have a desire to come back if there are jobs to come back to. Alastair went on to say that a level of funding to complete the mission of decommissioning the Dounreay site was defined under the new contract. If people left prematurely then more people would be needed to come into the area to complete the decommissioning programme. The benefits are that the site has secured steady funding to get to the interim end state for the site and that is good when planning the job profiles for the site.
