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Table 1 below illustrates the Claimant Count rates for June 2012, using the 2001 TTWAs (Travel to Work Areas). The Claimant Count rates are compared with May 2012 and June 2011 to highlight the monthly and annual changes. The TTWAs are ranked in descending order by the June 2012 figure.

Over the month to June 2012, the claimant count rose in 4, fell in 10 and was static in the remaining 4 TTWA's – Moray, Orkney Islands, Shetland Islands and Mull & Islay. Invergordon had the greatest increase over the month, rising 0.3% from 3.4% to 3.7%. Skye & Lochalsh and Lochgilphead shared the greatest decrease over the month, both falling by 0.3%.

Over the year to June 2012, the claimant count rose in 8, fell in 7 and was static in the remaining 3 TTWA's – Dunoon & Bute, Moray and Oban. Eilean Siar had the greatest increase over the month, rising 0.6% from 2.8% to 3.4%. Lochgilphead had the greatest decrease over the year, falling 0.5% from 2.3% to 1.8%.

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Table 2 below traces changes in the numbers (not rates) of unemployed people claiming benefits in the Highlands and Islands Enterprise Area Offices (AOs) between May 2012 and June 2012. A yearly comparison between June 2011 and June 2012 is also provided. The AOs are ranked in descending order by the size of the annual change in the number of unemployed, displayed in the right hand column.

Over the month May 2012 to June 2012, the number of people claiming unemployment benefit rose in 3, and fell in the remaining 5 area offices. Inner Moray Firth had the greatest increase over the year, rising 5.7% from 2,400 to 2,536 claimants. Lochaber, Skye & Wester Ross had the greatest decrease over the month, falling 10.2% from 558 to 501 claimants.

Over the year to June 2012, the number of people claiming unemployment benefit rose in 5, and fell 3 area offices. Innse Gall had the greatest increase over the year, rising 19.2% from 458 to 546 claimants. Caithness & Sutherland had the greatest decrease over the year, falling by 7.5% from 841 to 778 claimants.

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For the purpose of this analysis, long-term unemployment (LTU) is defined as 'all those who have been unemployed and claiming benefit for over 6 months'. Table 3 below shows the number of people who are long-term unemployed in June 2012 in each of the AOs. It also highlights the percentage change in the number of those claiming long-term unemployment benefit over the month (May 2012 to June 2012) and over the year (June 2011 to June 2012). The AOs are ranked by the right hand column, which contains the size of the annual percentage change in numbers of LTU.

Over the month May 2012 to June 2012, the number of long-term unemployment benefit claimants rose in 3, fell in 4 and was static in the remaining area office – Shetland. Orkney had the greatest increase over the month, rising 6.7% from 75 to 80 claimants. Lochaber, Skye & Wester Ross had the greatest decrease over the month, falling 13.0% from 230 to 200 claimants.

Over the year to June 2012, the number of people claiming long-term unemployment benefit rose in all 8 area offices. Orkney and Shetland shared the greatest increase over the year, both increasing 100% from 40 to 80 claimants.
