NDA funding to help attract jobs

The NDA has pledged £250,000 funding to help Wick Harbour in Scotland attract new jobs to the area. The NDA pledge supports the planned harbour upgrade aimed at attracting business from proposed offshore wind developments in the region. Highlands and Islands Enterprise (HIE) is also providing up to £200,000. The money, which has helped to attract additional private funding, is earmarked for the installation of heavy lift facilities at the port's commercial quay and the dredging of the entry channel to the quay.

Progress on Plutonium management

The NDA has shared with DECC the conclusions of the work we have recently undertaken regarding the management of the UK's separated plutonium stocks.

This work consisted of an updated assessment of the Government's preferred option, consideration of the credibility of alternative reuse proposals, for which the NDA has engaged GE-Hitachi and Candu to provide further information regarding their PRISM and Enhanced CANDU 6 (EC6) reactor proposals respectively; and an outline of what further work is required. DECC is currently considering our conclusions and we expect to be able to provide further information in the autumn.

Construction skills centre opens

More than half of the 52,945 fuel elements have now been removed from Sizewell A's twin reactors, with complete defuelling expected by September 2014. Dr Brian Burnett, NDA Head of Programmes, said: "This is an important milestone on the site's journey towards Care and Maintenance and a vital step in reducing hazard on the site."

Engagement continues on ILW and FED options

Additional workshops for stakeholders have now taken place as the NDA seeks to reduce the number of treatment options for Intermediate Level Waste (ILW) storage and Fuel Element Debris (FED) treatment at Magnox sites in England and Wales. More than 50 responses were received to earlier consultation papers. All comments will now be considered, while further engagement will take place with stakeholders before the preferred options are published towards the end of the year.

Regulators report on the scrutiny of RWMD's work

Two regulators have published the latest summary of their ongoing scrutiny of the NDA's Radioactive Waste Management Directorate (RWMD), covering April 2010 to March 2012. The Office for Nuclear Regulation and the Environment Agency both scrutinise and advise on RWMD's work relating to the implementation of geological disposal, including the provision of advice on packaging higher activity waste for disposal.

Sellafield box project

A huge procurement programme has been launched for thousands of high-integrity stainless steel boxes to house radioactive waste at Sellafield. Sellafield Ltd has released a pre-qualification questionnaire, a major step in the process to find two manufacturers for an initial quantity of 2,200 three-metre cubed boxes to store waste from the historic ponds and silos at the Cumbrian nuclear site. The Government is encouraging local suppliers to bid for the contract, which has the potential to span decades.

The preferred bidder will be announced in 2014.
