The Dounreay Stakeholder Group held its public meeting on Wednesday 21st September. In addition to those normally present DSG welcomed Charles Stewart-Roper (Scottish Government), Bill Hamilton (NDA Head of Stakeholder Relations) and Iain Davidson (ONR Inspector (Transport)).

- A presentation, followed by questions and answers, by ONR on the regulation of nuclear transport. The following discussion was a lively one. A number of follow up actions are now in place. See [DSG\(2016\)C029](#) for presentation from ONR.
- Dounreay site management informed DSG members of a safety stand down as part of their ongoing continuous improvement in safety and environmental performance and also the final warning letters from SEPA on a previously reported issue regarding the discharge of Krypton-85.
- Positive updates from Dounreay site regarding the completion of major hazard destruction both with NaK and PFR raffinate.
- NDA has allocated additional funding for the Dounreay site (over and above site annual budget). This funding will be provided over a two year period.
- A number of organisational changes have been made to the management at site. DSG welcomes the opportunity to meet with new management members at the earliest opportunity.
- Updates on the future options for the Vulcan site has been provided to DSG. DSG community representatives have indicated a strong desire to input into all options before a final decision has been made.
