What is Project Servator?



- Project Servator is designed to deny, detect and deter hostile activity, while providing a reassuring presence for the workforce and local community.
- Project Servator deployments co-ordinate a number of strands to achieve this:
 - Highly visible, targeted and unpredictable deployments.
 - The deployment of specially trained police officers.
 - Developing a network of vigilance.
 - Raising awareness of the public's role in helping us.
 - Encouraging engagement.

Where has the idea come from?



- Project Servator was launched by City of London Police in early 2014.
- It was also used during the Commonwealth Games in Glasgow by Police Scotland and partners in the summer of 2014.

What does Servator mean?

Servator is a Latin word. It means 'watcher' or 'observer'.

How/why do these tactics help deter criminals?



- CNC focus: those who pose a threat to security.
- Disrupting the planning of criminal and hostile activity.
- Informing and reassuring the public about the purpose of these deployments.
- Encourage public reporting "trust your instincts".



What will the workforce and public see?



- Workforce
 - Project Servator officers across the site.
 - They will also see posters and leaflets explaining what we are doing.
- Wider public
 - The local community may notice an increase in officers deployed to the areas surrounding site.
 - Posters and leaflets will be utilised via local businesses.
 - Project Servator is fuelled by the community!

Is this being implemented in response to a specific threat to Dounreay?



- This approach is not being taken in response to a specific threat to Dounreay.
- We have spent the best part of 2017 planning the introduction of Project Servator.



How can the public help?



- The public has a key role to play they are aware of what is out of the ordinary.
- We wish to reassure you by working closely with our industry partners and the local community to create a network of vigilance.



What will happen if I report something to the CNC Servator line?



- Secure telephone reporting.
- Email will be checked daily.
- Contact details will initially be distributed on site and in the surrounding area.
- Our aim is to maintain the security of Dounreay Site while reporting criminal activity to Police Scotland - in an emergency always call 999.
