## Annual General Meeting

- Alastair MacDonald and Bob Earnshaw were elected as Chairman and Vice Chairman respectively.
- The Terms of Reference will be amended to reflect an amendment discussed at the AGM.


## DSG main meeting

- DSRL provided a presentation on the progress of (o)-0.115971(v805600132g151.4698(e)11.4698( 159
- It was noted that a reduction in Dounreay site's emergency planning zone was being introduced. Vulcan also intimated they would be also be considering a reduction. DSG will write to Highland Council to ask for representation on the emergency planning meeting.
- A construction supplier's day will be held on $26^{\text {th }}$ March in Thurso for the three big construction projects which will get underway shortly on the Dounreay site.
- DSG submitted a response to the NDA draft business plan 2009-10.
- A smaller independent group will be set up as the predecessor of the Dounreay Particles Advisory Group (DPAG) to provide independent advice to SEPA and DSRL on the off-shore clean-up project.
- Melvich beach had recently been monitored and no particles were detected.
- Vulcan would provide an update on the future of the site at the next DSG meeting to be held in June.
- Update reports on regeneration issues were provided by Caithness and North Sutherland Regeneration Partnership, HIE and the Caithness Chamber of Commerce.
- The last payment of $£ 500 \mathrm{~K}$ has been provided by NDA for the North Highland Regeneration Fund. NDA's contribution now totals $£ 1.5 \mathrm{M}$.
- Representatives from DSG and Wick \& Thurso Trades Council attended the Labour and Lib Dem political conferences to lobby on behalf of the regeneration initiatives for the area.
