Health and Safety

In January a contractor received a minor first aid injury when he grazed his wrist whilst accessing the soap dispenser in the kitchen.

The formal report has now been received on the outcome of the Systems Based Inspection of the STF Active Ventilation System conducted in January. No Corrective Actions or Recommendations were made.

Vulcan Defuel and Decomissioning Programme

The Vulcan Defuel and Decommissioning (VDAD) Project remains focussed on detailed planning and the approvals required for defuel and fuel management activities that will continue on the site until 2022. The VDAD Project team have issued the Prior Information Note for the site decommissioning competition; this constitutes the first stage of the commercial process.
