




The case for change





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Benefits of changing strategy



Early release of sites

Going forward



- Formally moved away from blanket C&M to site specific decommissioning strategies.
- Trawsfynydd will be the lead site.
- Near-term scope is still largely dictated by non-reactor decommissioning hazards/risks (ILW/Asbestos/Asset Mgt.)
- Winfrith and Harwell remain unchanged...although dates will change.
- The site-specific decommissioning strategies for the other reactor sites are currently being developed.
- The site specific strategies will inform a revision to the existing programme business case, to outline the optimal approach for delivering the entire programme scope (April-21)

Site End States



12 sites, each with unique social, environmental and economic factors to consider; both now and in future.



Regulatory requirements have changed for the release of sites




There is potential to yield further value from our sites.



Our approach



- We have defined the credible options for all sites.
- Similar to the decommissioning strategies, each 'assumed' end state will now be derived from these credible options on a site-by-site basis in conjunction with the Site's Environmental Safety Case and Waste Management Plan.
- The programme to do all of this is currently being developed to align with regulatory expectations and the sitedecommissioning strategies.
- Trawsfynydd and Winfrith are complete, Hunterston A is scheduled later this year.
