

DOUNREAY SOCIO ECONOMIC ALLIANCE UPDATE as of 8th January 2021

The NDA and DSRL recognise that while our collective socio-economic support is focused on economic growth, there is a need to be respond to business recovery as we ease out of COVID-19 restrictions. Consideration has been given to ensure that the Dounreay Socio Economic Alliance (DSEA) - NDA, PBO and DSRL - is able to maintain the governance around consideration of socio-economic funding, while allowing quicker decisions to be made.

At this difficult time, there is recognition that some of the conditions linked to drawdown of funding for socio economic projects will be difficult to deliver. A flexible approach will be taken to continue to support these projects into the 2020/21 financial year.

SE Programme development

The programme of Socio economic activities has now been developed and monitoring of the delivery of these activities will be reported on a quarterly basis to DSG.

SE programme

The programme developed for socio economics includes both internal (related to business need) and external support. The programme provides details of:

- ~120 individual activities to deliver the programme
- Each activity has an 'owner' and delivery dates
- Is underpinned by resource requirements and risks/assumptions
- Has identified milestones to be delivered.

The main topics for the programme in the short term include:

- SE programme development
- Nuclear Services Hub business case development (with staged gate reviews)
- Skills audit / pilot and full audit
- People Plan and transition
- Investigation of other potential business cases (including spin outs and Hi Tech opportunities (including R&D).

The programme also covers the 'day to day' activities including:

- Development of Socio economic plan (yearly)
- Continued partnership working with CNSRP
- Governance of all external funding applications
- STEM activities
- Dounreav Communities Fund administration
- Reporting (quarterly)

COVID-19 support

- DSRL continues to offer support to the area for Covid related activities.
- Requests for support and/or funding are now considered on a case by case basis.
- During the Christmas period staff were encouraged to go out and provide some community support.
- Discussions are ongoing with NHS for potential support for the rolling out of vaccines.

Dounreay Heritage (Oct to December 2020)

- No heritage objects were collected in the period.
- No leavers completed a Dounreay Memories form.
- James Gunn, in his role as the NDA Heritage Officer, has drafted an NDA guidance document about selecting heritage objects for preservation purposes. It is based on Dounreay experience and will be reviewed by representatives from the national museums of Scotland, England and Wales.

Misc

- Dounreay's first batch of homegrown health physics surveyors qualified ahead of schedule. The 7 trainees are the first to be trained by DSRL and Nuvia jointly in a programme that utilised Nuvia's National Vocational Qualification Centre. (NVQ). While the training was due to take around 2 years the hard work and commitment of both trainees and supervisors saw the course completed in 19 months and all are now deployed across the Dounreay site.
- DSRL was delighted to see David Flear, former chair of the DSG, being awarded an MBE for services to health, community care and the community.
- As part of the EDI (Equality, Diversify and Inclusiveness) action plan, DSRL has encouraged staff to take part in the 2020 working families benchmark survey.
- Virtual coffee mornings have continued on a weekly basis to allow staff to connect with each other while continuing to work from home.
- Dounreay's annual awards event took place virtually at the end of last year, allowing more staff to participate than ever before. Hosted by Nicky Marr, the event raised over £3k in donations for the nominated charity Caithness Mental Health Support Group. The awards are based on the site's values and the winners were:
