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## NDA Group Narrative

The NDA Group holds world leading capability in decommissioning, clean up, management and disposal of nuclear facilities and waste products, and our mission represents Europe's largest environmental remediation programme

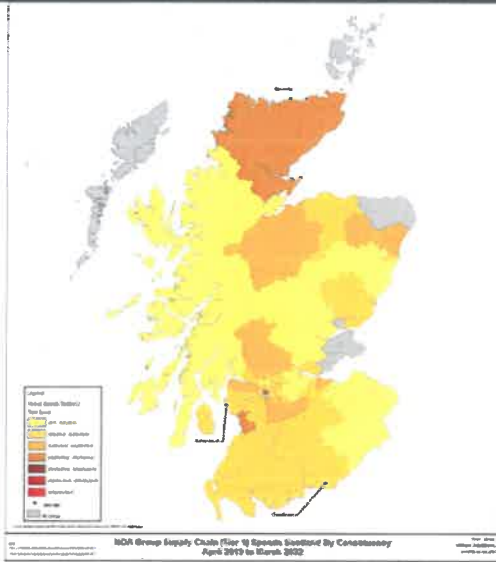
- Our mission is to deliver safe, sustainable and publicly acceptable solutions to the challenge of nuclear clean-up and waste management
- We play an essential role in the nuclear life cycle - managing and storing waste in a safe and sustainable way and returning sites for societal use
- We own 17 sites across the UK including 3 in Scotland, some dating back to the 1940s, plus the associated liabilities and assets
- We offer world leading capability within the Group bringing together decommissioning expertise, including waste and transport solutions
- Our workforce is highly skilled with over 17,000 employees across the NDA Group – well over 2,000 jobs are supported in Scotland with more than 1,700 in total involved in Dounreay (direct and supply chain) and more than 500 local jobs supported across Chapelcross and Hunterston A.

## Overall Scotland Nuclear Decommissioning Narrative

Scotland plays a fundamental role within the NDA Group – and we expect that to grow further in the coming years

- There are three NDA sites in Scotland – Dounreay (one of two category 1 sites in the Group), Hunterston A & Chapelcross
- NDA spends about £300m per year in Scotland – over £200m for Dounreay alone – a recent local Economic Impact Study shows that Dounreay contributes just over £77m per annum to the local economy and 11% of local jobs (Caithness and North Sutherland area)
- Our economic impact is significant – we partner with 465 supply chain companies in Scotland alone – with a spend of £128m 2019-2021 (11% of our total supply chain spend)
- Dounreay led British efforts to develop fast reactor technology in the 1950's and today is a 'lead and learn' site for decommissioning
- Hunterston A&B stations – Hunterston B is set to be the first AGR station to be decommissioned in the UK and will transfer to the NDA once the fuel has been removed
- In the coming years, we will add Torness and potentially MoD Vulcan site to our portfolio as we are trusted to do more.
- Scotland's decommissioning activity is increasing significantly over the next 5 years. This demonstrates that 'decommissioning' is the start of something rather than the end
- Growth is not without its challenges – but there are also opportunities - as we continue to build world class skills and supply chains.
