DOUNREAY SOCIO ECONOMIC UPDATE current as of 16th of January 2023

Introduction

DSRL and Magnox Ltd will merge on the 1st of April 2023. There are no changes envisaged for Dounreay socio economic activity due to the merger in 2023/24.

Socio Economics Manager

Magnus Davidson is now in post as the Dounreay Socio Economics Manager as of 25 November 2022.

Dounreay Socio Economic Plan

An updated Dounreay Socio Economic Plan was planned for year 2022/23, however due to structural and staffing changes, the new plan was postponed to 2023/24.

The NDA will be developing a new socioeconomic strategy in 2023 and early in the year there will be discussion on the alignment of the new Dounreay Socio Economic Plan with the NDA Socio Economic Plan.

Focus North

Caithness and North Sutherland Regeneration Partnership (CNSRP) have now rebranded as Focus North with a relaunch event scheduled for the 8th of February at the Weigh Inn Thurso. Two representatives of the Dounreay Stakeholder Group have been invited.

Grant funding

The continued governance of socio economic grant funding activities is recorded below. The decision making process and governance arrangements is the responsibility of the DSRL Socio Economic Funding Group. The information below has been updated to reflect the commitments for grant funding for 2022/23. Further updates will reflect progress on the impacts of these projects.

Other socio economic activities

- NDA has now received the final application for potential support for Space Hub Sutherland. This application is now going through internal NDA due process. The One NDA Socio Economic Panel endorsed the application in early January 2023 with the application going to the NDA executive later in the month.
- NDA, along with HIE, continue discussions with Wick Harbour Authority in relation to funding to support harbour developments and business growth.

Procurement

- A contract for 40 solid waste drums is currently being awarded to a Caithness company, this is as a result of a Reserved for Caithness procurement.
- Over the past quarter, 16 contracts were awarded to 8 Caithness suppliers value £1.045M.

STEM

- Dounreay's apprentices supported the Hydrogen Challenge workshops and Highland Final in Inverness. Pupils from Thurso, Wick and Farr High Schools participated in the challenge with Farr High School taking one of the winning places and will now participate in the Grand Final.
- Dounreay hosted the annual Engineering Industry Day on 6 December for students from UHI North Highland and senior phase pupils from Thurso, Wick and Farr High Schools.
 Representatives from Dounreay, Rolls Royce, JGC Engineering, Nuvia and UHI North Highland provided advice to 51 students/pupils in preparation for engineering apprenticeship recruitment. Advice was provided



on application forms/CVs, interview technique, current apprentices from Dounreay and Rolls Royce spoke about their experiences during the recruitment phase and what they do as part of their apprenticeship and UHI North Highland provided advice on other routes into engineering.

- Six Dounreay STEM Ambassadors supported mock interviews at Thurso, Wick and Farr High Schools during November and December.
- Representatives from Dounreay have attended senior phase parent evenings during November and December to promote the early career opportunities available at Dounreay. This has been well received and will continue through to March.
- STAR Crest Award is being delivered by a Dounreay STEM Ambassador to P1-P4 at Thrumster Primary School. The pupils complete 8 different activities to complete their award.
- Apprentices are supporting Lybster/Dunbeath Primary with their Goblin Car. It is proposed the team will attend the final in Alford in June.
- Support to the 12 primary and secondary schools participating in the First Lego
 League Challenge has been provided on a weekly basis; each team has a STEM
 Ambassador or two apprentices supporting them. The weekly support will continue
 until the end of January and then reducing to monthly until the North Highland
 Tournament on 3 May.

Staffing

- Applications for the Dounreay 2-year graduate development programme closed on the 31st of December. The 2-year structured programme helps ten graduates to take their first step towards a challenging and rewarding career in the nuclear decommissioning industry. Graduates work alongside experienced professionals in a range of disciplines and are given the opportunity to develop a breadth of practical skills and experience.
- Liam Gordon has been shortlisted for the Graduate of the Year Award by the National Skills Academy for Nuclear (NSAN). Liam is currently working with the Fuels team. Liam will be interviewed by the judging panel in early January with the winner announced at the UK Nuclear Skills Awards Ceremony and Dinner in March.
- Vacation Student placements are currently being advertised for the Summer of 2023.
 Placements are designed to offer candidates the opportunity to gain frontline practical experience and develop the skills necessary for careers in engineering, science, and business.
- Dounreay apprenticeship advertisement continues with an annual intake of 11 apprentices across engineering, business and administration, built environment, and carpentry and joinery.
- The latest group of project control trainees' has passed their Engineering Construction Industry Training Board (ECITB) Level 3 qualification in Project Controls. The training was delivered over 9 months by 20/20 Project Management and was aimed at giving a practical introduction into project controls. The delegates gave their final presentations last month and received excellent feedback.



Dounreay Heritage

Collection of objects

Recording of memories

• A process to capture the memories of those leaving the site is in place. A form with 5 questions is sent to leavers, but not everyone completes it. Four forms were returned in the quarter.

Community engagement

- The Dounreay heritage community project continued with two more gatherings of former employees and some spouses. They were held in the North Coast Visitor Centre and covered chats about old times and a review of photos. The topics were recreation and VIP visits. It is a joint initiative between DSRL, Highlife Highland, NDA, and Nucleus.
- The BBC picked up the story about the project and posted an article about atomic housing on their website. This resulted in James Gunn and former employee David Lord being interviewed on the BBC's Good Morning Scotland radio programme.
- The next gathering is due on 20 January 2023 and the topic is donations and help to the local community.

NDA heritage

• James Gunn has been acting as the NDA's Heritage Officer since 2020. This parttime role has progressed into a full-time one and a new NDA Heritage Officer was appointed in November 2022. The person does not work for the NDA directly, but is an employee of Restore Digital, who manage the Nucleus Archives.

Dounreay history

- James Gunn gave a talk on Dounreay's history to the Thurso branch of the University of the Third Age (U3A). He also acted as a tour guide for a site visit of Japanese university students and their tutors.
- Dounreay's 70th anniversary is due in 2025 and James Gunn has been given the Director's approval to write and publish a book to celebrate this milestone.

Visits

 A group of Japanese students and lecturers, led by Professor Okamoto, and Dr Tanaka, visited for a tour of PFR and a series of meetings with our teams and stakeholders.



Other Site Activities

- Dounreay staff donated £4,527 during December for the benefit of three local charities at Christmas:
