DOUNREAY SOCIO ECONOMIC UPDATE current as of 12 July 2023

NDA Social Impact and Communities Strategy

In June the NDA socio economics team visited Dounreay to meet with staff and stakeholders. The visit was, in part, to consult on a refresh of the NDA Social Impact and Communities Strategy, with the team meeting the DSG Chair and Vice Chair, Socio Economics Sub Group, and members of the Focus North Delivery Group. Discussion on social value, with social impact representation from Sellafield, was held with Dounreay's commercial team.

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Dounreay Socio Economic Strategy

Dounreay is aiming for publication of a refreshed socio economic strategy in October. The DSG will be consulted as part of this process with input from the NDA consultation also included.

Grant funding

An annual socio economic review for FY 2022/23 is nearing completion and will be due out shortly with a refreshed format.

Dounreay continues to provide pre-application support for socio economic funding with several groups and organisations are in active discussion on potential funding for 2023/2024.

The continued governance of socio economic grant funding activities is recorded in Appendix 1, with new projects funded in the previous quarter found below:

- Wick PSO Study £25,000. Study on impact of price as driver of demand on Wick- Aberdeen Air Services
- Caithness Chamber of Commerce Options Appraisal £6,500. Options appraisal on governance model/s for industry member
- Thurso Community Café £5,000. Community clothing project

Other socio economic activities

- The Dounreay Sustainability and Socio Economic team, alongside a representative of the commercial team, presented on sustainability and social value at a supply chain engagement event held at UHI North Highland in June.
- The Dounreay Sustainability and Socio Economics Team presented on Dounreay innovation in sustainability and socio economics at the NDA Innovation and Technology Roadshow. Representatives of the DSG were also in attendance.

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Procurement

- Contracts were awarded to 11 Caithness suppliers in Q1 23/24
- There were 45 respective contracts to a value of £1.43M
- Two of these were reserved procurements

There has been increased work this quarter by the socio economics and commercial team at implementation of Public Procurement Note 06/20 on Social Value. In parallel there is a body of work being undertaken to further target social value interventions to area needs, in part through the work of Focus North.

<u>Staffing</u>

Recruitment continues to be carefully managed. Dounreay shares full details of all internal and external recruitment with the DSG business group to ensure transparency. In the last quarter there has been very little recruitment activity, however in the previous week a number of vacancies were approved to proceed, and a report sent to the DSG.

Recruitment of early year's careers has concluded for 2023 with final figures summarised as:

- 14 Graduates (12 Dounreay and 2 NDA)
- 10 Engineering apprentices (1 Design, 4 Electrical, 2 Instrument, 2 Mechanical)
- 1 Scaffolder apprentice
- 1 Joiner apprentice
- 5 Business apprentices
- 15 Summer students

<u>STEM</u>

Planning of STEM events/activities to be rolled out during academic year 2023/24 has commenced with a review of the Key STEM Ambassadors is being undertaken during the summer break.

Early discussion with UHI's STEM Development Manager on re-establishing the North Highland STEM Hub Group and how UHI and Dounreay can work together going forward. This will be developed further once UHI's STEM Coordinator, based in the Thurso Campus, is in post in August. Event highlights include:

- Dounreay's STEM Ambassadors supported the Science Skills Academy's "Up in the air with numbers" module to Thurso High School pupils in mid-April. Dounreay has arranged for their flight simulator to be set up in ETEC during the summer holidays to allow apprentices to be trained and any other individuals identified for training. Three UHI lecturers will be trained on their return after the summer break.
- First Lego League Challenge North Highland Tournament was held on 3 May at ETEC. 8 teams participated in the day where they presented their Innovation Project and Robot Design to a panel of judges. The feedback from

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the schools and pupils has been excellent and now organisers (Dounreay, DYW North Highland and UHI) are planning next year's challenge and tournament..

- STAR Crest Award has been completed by pupils at Noss Primary School and Thrumster Primary School. The pupils had to complete 8 different activities to complete their award, with all activities being delivered by Dounreay STEM Ambassadors.
- A STEM day was held at Noss Primary School on 9 June. All pupils attended with each pupil participating in two different activities delivered by Dounreay STEM Ambassadors.
