Highland Council Community Support and Engagement Team New Structure and Ways of Working

Briefing for Community Councils, Organisations and Partners

1 Background

Following a review, the structure and function of the Community Support and Engagement Team has changed moving away from the previous Ward Management arrangements, which focussed on ward geographies, to a more flexible team.

The drivers for the review included the new duties on the team as a result of the Community Empowerment Act, changes in Council priorities, an overall reduction in team resource since the original delivery model had been in place and the need to deliver a budget saving agreed by Council in March 2023. The new structure was agreed at a meeting of the Council in October 2023 and implemented in March 2024. The new team will operate across an area geography of three areas as follows:

2 Roles

There are 5 key roles in the new team:

Senior Community Development Manager – lead area committee planning, lead area service team meetings, lead partner contact for emergency planning, area partnerships, Council lead for specific areas of work e.g. equality and poverty, place planning, engagement, common good

Community Development Manager – lead support for area committees and member business meetings, co-ordination cross-service projects, co-ordinate Council input to place planning/community planning, each with a functional remit for a key area of work e.g. asset transfer/community councils

Community Support Officer – support and capacity building of groups to develop Community Asset Transfers/food growing/resilience activity, point of contact for community groups including community councils, co-ordination and assessment local funding applications.

Community Benefits Manager – Developing the Council's approach to community benefits from procurement, support to services and suppliers in developing community benefit approaches and matching opportunities to community need.

Equalities and Inequalities officer – Lead officer for statutory equality reporting, advice and guidance on equality and inequality training and development and increasing engagement and involvement with under-represented groups.

Common Good – responsible for monitoring and reporting in relation to Common Good for the area.


Community Council enquiries – addressing and responding to Community Council enquiries.
