DOUNREAY SOCIO ECONOMIC UPDATE current as of 17 April 2024

NDA Social Impact and Communities Strategy

The NDA published their Social Impact and Communities Strategy on 5 April. The strategy sets out the NDA's obligations and strategic approach to supporting communities and to maximising the social impact of NDA work.

The appendix of the strategy highlights NDA commitments to NRS Dounreay with commitments aligned to the consultation undertaken with the DSG in June of 2023.

Dounreay Socio Economic Strategy

As previously reported, NRS Dounreay has developed a draft socio economic strategy. This draft has been deferred to align with Group Key Target requirements for 2024/25. The DSG will be consulted as part of this process with input from the NDA consultation also included, before being finalised.

Grant funding

Dounreay continues to provide pre-application support for socio economic funding with several groups and organisations are in active discussion on potential funding for 2023/2024 and 2024/2025.

The continued governance of socio economic grant funding activities is recorded in Appendix 1, with new projects funded in the previous quarter found below:

- Wick Harbour Authority Harbour Improvement Works Phase 1, £150,000
- Rumster Outdoor Centre Outdoor Classroom, £43.000
- Pentland Yacht Club Training Fleet, £21,224
- Scottish Surfing Championships National Competition, £10,000
- Caithness Business Fund Future Skills Apprenticeship Programme £100,000, (50% NDA, 50% Dounreay)
- North Highland Initiative Community Resilience Fund £30,000, (50% NDA, 50% Dounreay).

In 2023/24 Dounreay supported a total of 25 projects or programmes (Focus North Support, Dounreay Communities Fund, and STEM resources) with a total spend of £1.03m, leveraging an additional £7.07m of private and public sector investment into Caithness and north Sutherland.

Other socio economic activities

The Dounreay Socio Economic team joined the OneNDA Socio Economic team visit to Sellafield from 6 to 7 February. The combined quarterly meeting is part of NDA strategy development and cross learning from other areas.

Magnus Davidson presented on opportunities of the Caithness and north Sutherland area at the annual Focus North Conference and AGM on 19 March.

David Calder, Head of Sustainability and Socio Economics at NRS Dounreay, attended the first Cross Party Group on Civil Nuclear Industry on March 27 at the Scottish Parliament. The forum is for Members of the Scottish Parliament stakeholders and interested parties to engage directly with each other in order to raise awareness of the opportunities and challenges facing nuclear decommissioning and the existing associated civil nuclear footprint, workforce, and supply chain in Scotland and to better inform the development of policy in this important area.

Procurement

In regard to local supply chain:

- Contracts were awarded to 15 Caithness registered suppliers in Q4 23/24
- There were 52 respective contracts to a value of £2.14M
- Two of these were reserved procurements.

In addition:

- Contracts were awarded to 5 National companies performing work from Caithness in Q4 23/24
- There were 7 respective contracts to a value of £219k.

In total 59 contracts were awarded to 20 suppliers registered in Caithness or performing work from Caithness with a total value of £2.36m

The socio economics team, working with the commercial team, continue to improve how Dounreay sets, assesses, and monitors social value across in scope procurements, with further training undertaken in the last quarter. Work is underway to further identify local need for social value commitments in Caithness and north Sutherland.

Staffing

Recruitment continues to be carefully managed. Dounreay shares full details of all internal and external recruitment with the DSG business group to ensure transparency. The most recent report went to the DSG in February with a small number of external recruitments taking place due to promotion and resignations.

Successful recruitment of the 2024 annual intake of graduates (13 total), and engineering apprentices in electrical, mechanical, and control and instrumentation (10 total) were also completed in the last quarter.

STEM

Dounreay has an ongoing review of how STEM provision is supported, with the aim of improving and enhancing support, building on existing initiatives in the area. Activity in the last quarter includes:

- STEM First Lego League North Highland Tournament held on 13 March 2024. 8 teams participated with positive feedback from teachers, pupils and volunteers. First Lego League Challenge North Highland Tournament winner from Newton Park Primary is competing in the UK Final in Harrogate on 20 April. NRS Dounreay is funding the transport costs
- STEM Dounreay STEM Ambassadors supported the roll out of SSA's up in the air with numbers module at Wick High School in March. Roll out of the module continues during April to pupils from Thurso, Farr, and Golspie High Schools
- STEM Caithness Science Festival Family Fun Day on 23 March. NRS Dounreay had a stand with STEM activities and demonstrations by SPOT.
- STEM Goblin Cars project progressing at Miller Academy and Dunbeath/Lybster primaries. Miller is supported by 2 STEM Ambassadors and 4 apprentices. NRS Dounreay is sponsoring Miller Academy pupils attending the Goblin competition in Alford in June
- STEM CREST Award is being delivered by Dounreay STEM Ambassadors to 2 x P5 classes at Noss Primary School through April to June.

Heritage

- Linda Ross, an NDA Bursary funded post-doctoral researcher presented "More than a Half-Life: Communities, Heritage and Decommissioning" visited Caithness in March 2024 to undertake the recording of memories of former staff and DSG members. A conference featuring numerous speakers, including James Gunn, and Magnus Davidson, is due to be held in the Pentland Hotel on 22 May 2024 and invites will be sent in April. The invites will include DSG members.
- The Dounreay Reminiscence Group had sessions in Nucleus and Castlehill Heritage Centre in the last quarter with attendance growing.
- National Museums Scotland are designing an exhibition about Scotland and the Cold War, and it will mention Dounreay and Vulcan. The exhibition is due to open in July 2024 and will feature three historic objects from Dounreay.
- Dounreay have supported North Coast Visitor Centre with the installation of two new timeline panels in the Dounreay area of the museum. These new panels update previous timelines displayed, updating activity to date.
 Dounreay continues to support NCVC with socio economic grant funding.

• No historic objects were added to the heritage collection in this period.

Visits to Dounreay

- The BBC attended site to film for the technology programme Click on 29 February. The clip can be made available to DSG
- Fiona Rayment and Emma Feguson-Gould attended site and took part in Dounreay's Gender Balance Network's seventh annual event, 6 March
- Group Wide Energy Programme, 27 March the group's work is looking at investment of NDA funds on NDA land for projects aimed at lowering the cost of energy and carbon emissions across the NDA group as a whole.
